This section is an analysis of all rated and unrated Exchange-Traded Funds and Other Closed-End Mutual Funds, listed alphabetically by fund name. Each company represented is measured on factors such as: Fund Type, Overall Investment Rating, Price, 52-Week High, 3-Year Total Return, Dividend Yield, Expense Ratio, Cash %, Portfolio Turnover Rate and many more, 34 in total.

Section II is a **summary analysis of all Exchange-Traded Funds** and Other Closed-End Mutual Funds receiving a TheStreet.com Investment Rating. These summaries are made up of several components and also contain graphs and charts to assist the user in understanding the data. Components of the analyses include: Investment Rating, Major Rating Factors, Fund Family, Fund Type, Inception Date and Ticker Symbol.
