This second edition of *The History of Canada* is the first published by Grey House Publishing. The first edition was published by Greenwood Press in 2001. This ten-year update not only reflects Canada's trials and triumphs in the past decade, but also includes a significant amount of new material and features.

The main body of text in this new edition consists of eleven chapters, one more than in 2001. They are arranged chronologically, taking the reader from the first wave of migration 12,000 years ago to today's film and sports industries that cross international borders. Each chapter is amply subtitled, providing logical steps from one period in Canadian history to another. From *Early Exploration* to the *Quebec Experiment* to the *Canadian Nationalism Triumph* to the *Nuances of Modern Politics*, this edition offers tremendous value for novices of Canadian history as well as those whose generational family lived through every stage of the country's progression.

Primary Documents is a new section of *The History of Canada*. It includes carefully selected articles, legislation, letters and excerpts. Designed to support chapter themes, each document is referenced in the main text. A separate Table of Contents identifies the 38 diverse documents, with "Prime Minister Harper Announces Measures to Strengthen Canada's Arctic Sovereignty" and the "Joe Canadian Rant" on the list.

Notable People in the History of Canada follow the final chapter, with biographies of men and women who helped define this vast country. The list of 41 comprises politicians, journalists, explorers, religious figures, writers, educators, activists and artists and includes 10 more individuals than the last edition.
