

How to Use American Book Publishing Record® Cumulative

Entries in the **American Book Publishing Record®** are arranged in three sections: the Main Section consists of the complete bibliographic record and is arranged as follows: Dewey range 000-999, Adult Fiction, and Juvenile Fiction. There are three indexes that serve as access points: Author, Title, and Subject Guide.

MAIN SECTION

Dewey Sequence 000 - 999

Entries are filed by primary Dewey only up to the ninth digit within their respective alphabetical main entry sequence. This sequence is by author, or by title in lieu of an author.

Adult Fiction

These entries are classified by the Library of Congress as general adult fiction. They are filed alphabetically by main entry. Dewey and Call Numbers are sometimes within the body of these entries, which further serves to classify the category of fiction. For example, an entry with a Dewey Number of 813 is American fiction. Other numbers taken from specific subdivision tables and appended to the main number further define the specific time period. For example, 813.54 is American fiction 20th century.

Juvenile Fiction

These entries are classified by the Library of Congress as general juvenile fiction. They are filed alphabetically by main entry.

One category of juvenile titles that can be defined as fiction but will not be found in this section is folklore literature titles. They include riddles, rhymes, and so on, and will be found under their appropriate Dewey Number—398. Picture song books can be found under Dewey Number—782.42.

INDEXES

The sequence of the author and title indexes is alphabetical; where numbers appear in the title, they are filed as spoken. For example, Henry V is filed as Henry the Fifth. Entries in the Subject Guide Index represent primary subjects only and are arranged alphabetically. Entries in Author, Title, and Subject Guide indexes are referenced to the main section by author, title, and Dewey.

Author

Entries included in this index are primary contributors only. Approximately 58,200 contributors are included in this index. These include personal names, corporate entities as well as uniform contributors, e.g., Bible, and are filed alphabetically by primary contributor(s).
