

Introduction

This 2024 edition of *Associations Canada* published by Grey House Publishing Canada includes over 20,200 associations, both those that are headquartered in Canada, as well as those headquartered elsewhere with branches in Canada. The Canadian associations are followed by a separate section of Foreign Associations that are of a particular interest to Canadians.

ADOPTING CONSTRUCTIVE BEHAVIOURS AND RESPONSES WHEN IN CONFLICT

As a senior association executive for over 30 years, I always prided myself on my conflict management skills. After all, I never avoided conflict, and maintained an open-door policy. I encouraged those who brought their conflicts to me to concentrate on the facts and leave emotions out of it. And I often played "the fixer," giving a range of solutions.

Like many people, I saw conflicts as something to be resolved as quickly as possible. It wasn't until my post-retirement career when I became a mediator, then a conflict management coach and instructor, that my explorations into the foundational elements of conflict made me realize that my approach was lacking. I wasn't doing everything wrong, but I lacked an understanding of the constructive possibilities of conflict, and a more comprehensive set of behaviours and responses that would lead to long-term outcomes rather than short-term fixes.

UNDERSTANDING THE NATURE OF CONFLICT

When I teach about conflict, I ask participants, "What is one word that comes to mind when you think about conflict?" Invariably, the answers fall into a negative category like anger, avoidance, emotional, anxiety, stress and so on. Rarely are responses like "opportunity" or "collaboration" ever mentioned.

On a basic level, our negative view of conflict is grounded in neuroscience with a pre-wired conflict management system in our brain. Like just about every creature on earth, we have a limbic system including an amygdala where emotions lie. This part of the brain is active 24/7 and serves as a filter to keep us safe. It tells us whether we are encountering a situation that is a treat or a threat. If it's a threat, it springs us into a fight or flight action. All of this happens in a split second with no thinking required.

Layer in conditioning from our upbringing, environment, and interactions with people over time, and it is not hard to see that if our own emotional brain begins to collide with someone else's emotional brain, things can spiral out of control and put us into a conflict trap.

However, unlike other creatures, we also have a pre-frontal cortex that allows us to think our way through conflict situations. This part of our brain was never designed to protect us from immediate threats, and reacts at a much slower pace than our emotional brain. During conflict, our emotional side often can't calm down enough to make room for the pre-frontal cortex to do its thinking work, and that thinking brain gets hijacked into behaviours that are destructive instead of constructive.

MAKING CONFLICT CONSTRUCTIVE INSTEAD OF DESTRUCTIVE

Despite our discomfort with conflict and our desire to avoid it, in reality, there is no such thing as a conflict-free life. From the fights over screen time with our teens, to fence-line disputes with neighbours, to
