

## Introduction

This is the fifth edition of *Profiles of New Jersey—Facts, Figures & Statistics for 877 Populated Places in New Jersey*. As with the other titles in our *State Profiles* series, it was built with content from Grey House Publishing's award-winning *Profiles of America*—a 4-volume compilation of data on more than 43,000 places in the United States. We have updated and included the New Jersey chapter from *Profiles of America*, and added several new chapters of demographic information and ranking sections, so that *Profiles of New Jersey* is the most comprehensive portrait of the state of New Jersey ever published.

*Profiles of New Jersey* provides data on all populated communities and counties in the states for which the US Census provides individual statistics. This edition also includes profiles of 94 unincorporated places based on US Census data by zip code.

This premier reference work includes seven major sections that cover everything from **Education** to **Ethnic Backgrounds** to **Climate**. All sections include **Comparative Statistics** or **Rankings**. Here is an overview of each section:

### 1. About New Jersey

This 4-color section gives the researcher a real sense of the state and its history. It includes a Photo Gallery, and comprehensive sections on New Jersey's History, Government, Land and Natural Resources, Energy and Demographic Maps. With charts and maps, these 41 pages help to anchor the researcher to the state, both physically and politically.

### 2. Profiles

This section, organized by county, give detailed profiles of 877 places plus 21 counties, based on Census 2010 and data from the most recent American Community Survey. We have added current government statistics and original research, so that these profiles pull together statistical and descriptive information on every Census-recognized place in each state. Major fields of information include:

**NEW** categories to this edition include data on selected monthly owner costs with and without a mortgage, the number of dentists per capita, and annual median and maximum Air Quality Index values. In addition to place profiles, this section includes a **Place Name Index**.

### 3. Comparative Statistics

This section include tables that compare New Jersey's 100 largest communities by dozens of data points.

### 4. Community Rankings

This section include tables that rank the top and bottom 150 communities with population over 2,500, in dozens of categories.

### 5. Education

This section begins with an **Educational State Profile**, summarizing number of schools, students, diplomas granted and educational dollars spent. Following the state profile are **School District Rankings** on 16 topics ranging from *Teacher/Student Ratios* to *High School Drop-Out Rates*. Following these rankings are statewide *National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)* results and data from the *Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)*—an overview of student performance by subject.

### 6. Ancestry and Ethnicity

This section provides a detailed look at the ancestral, Hispanic and racial makeup of New Jersey's 200+ ethnic categories. Data is ranked three ways: 1) by number, based on all places regardless of population; 2) by percent, based on all places regardless of population; 3) by percent, based on places with populations of

50,000 or more. You will discover, for example, that Lakewood Township has the greatest number of *Hungarians* in the state (3,772), and that 5.6% of the population of Saddle River are of *Armenian* ancestry.

### 7. Climate

Each state chapter includes a State Summary, three colorful maps and profiles of both National and Cooperative Weather Stations. In addition, you'll find Weather Station Rankings with hundreds of interesting details, such as Charlotteburg Reservoir reporting the highest annual snowfall with 34.4 inches.

Note: The extensive **User Guide** that follows this introduction is segmented into four sections and examines, in some detail, each data field in the individual profiles and comparative sections for all chapters. It provides sources for all data points and statistical definitions as necessary.

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*Trenton is the capital of New Jersey, and the state's 10th largest city. It was also, for a brief time, the capital of the United States. Located on the Delaware River, near the exact geographical center of the state, Trenton is nicknamed "Capital City, Turning Point of the Revolution. Its motto is "Trenton Makes, The World Takes." It was a major manufacturing center in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, known for rubber, wire, rope, ceramics and cigars. Today, Trenton's biggest employer is the state of New Jersey.*



*The Central Railroad of New Jersey Terminal, aka Communipaw Terminal, was built in 1889 and was operational until 1967. On the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places, and a New Jersey State Historic Site, the terminal at Liberty State Park now is home to ferry slips that serve boats to Statue of Liberty National Monument, Ellis Island, and Liberty Island.*





*Newark is the largest city in New Jersey, and one of the nation's major air, shipping and rail hubs. Located eight miles west of Manhattan, the city's Port Newark is the largest container shipping terminal on the East Coast, and Newark Liberty International Airport was the country's first municipal commercial airport and today, is one of its busiest. Newark is known for its cultural diversity, and the nation's largest collection of cherry blossom trees—about 4,300.*



*Great Falls is located on the Passaic River in northern New Jersey. At 77 feet, it is the second highest waterfall on the East Coast, and has been featured in the television series *The Sopranos*, in several episodes. Great Falls was designated a National Natural Landmark in 1967, and was authorized as a National Historical Park in 2009. In 2011, it was formally dedicated at the nation's 397th park system.*

**ATLANTIC CITY** (city). Covers a land area of 10.747 square miles and a water area of 6.290 square miles. Located at 39.38° N. Lat; 74.45° W. Long. Elevation is 7 feet.

**History:** The history of Atlantic City is a success story of a city that knew what it wanted to be from its very infancy. Before 1852, Atlantic City was an island waste five miles off the mainland. It was known as Absecon Island or Absecon Beach. Once the climate and beach of the Island were appraised, it was not long before a railroad from Camden was under construction. The city was incorporated in 1854 and the first train arrived from Camden that same year. Many dined at a still incomplete hotel. Other hotels were being built, and a second railroad arrived in 1877. The boardwalk was the joint conception in 1870 of a local hotel man, Jacob Keim, and a conductor on the Camden and Atlantic, Alexander Boardman. The next milestone in the history of the resort was the invention of the rolling chair in 1884 by M.D. Shill. In 1895, the picture postcard was brought to Atlantic City, the idea being adopted from Germany. Salt water taffy and an amusement pier followed.
