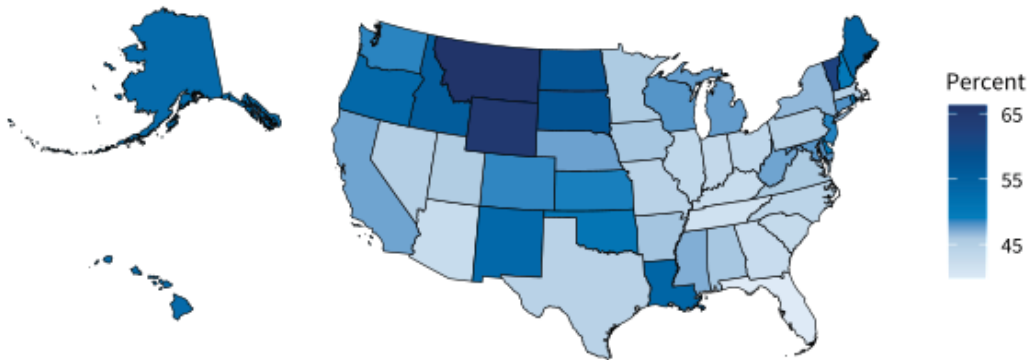

Share of employees working at small businesses by state

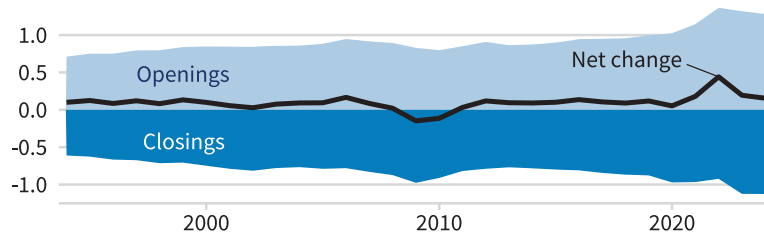

Employer and employment dynamics

Establishments

Between March 2023 and March 2024, 1,281,290 establishments opened and 1,125,979 closed, for a net increase of 155,311. Employment expanded at 2.1 million establishments and contracted at 2.0 million. Small businesses accounted for 1.1 million openings and 982,940 closings.

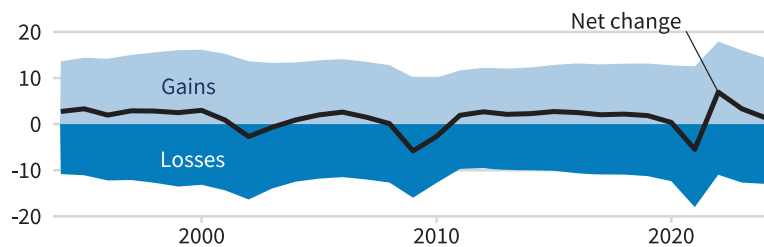

Employment

Opening and expanding U.S. establishments added 14.4 million jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 13.0 million, for a net increase of 1.4 million jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 1.2 million jobs, or 88.9 percent of that total.

Market Research

Industry

Built-Rite Toys will be a part of the toy manufacturing industry. Currently, wooden toys are considered a niche market, comprised of different sized companies. The largest companies, such as Plastique Toys and Metal Happy Toys, have large inventories of products that are offered internationally. The smallest companies sell locally either in shops, at craft fairs, or online.

This industry is currently suffering from the economic recession as consumers are spending less on non-essentials. However, industry revenues increased by \$1.2 million in the 2nd quarter of 2012. This means there is a potential for growth as the economy recovers.

Detailed Description of Customers

The two groups that the company plans to market to are parents (age 18-30) of young children and grandparents (age 60-75) of young children with an income range of \$35,000 - \$80,000 a year. Our target customers are interested in giving durable, well-made toys to their children and grandchildren to help foster creativity. They value quality and they research the products they buy. Our target customers are willing to spend more money on products that are of higher quality and last longer.

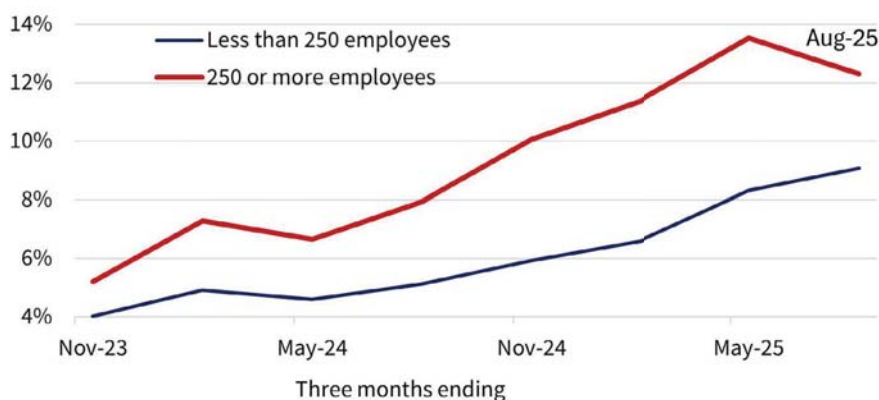

Since the public release of ChatGPT by OpenAI in late November 2022, the adoption of artificial intelligence (AI) has increased at an unprecedented rate. In August of 2024, 39 percent of U.S. adults reported using AI, more than double the early adoption rates of personal computers and the internet.¹ To meet this demand businesses have invested billions of dollars² and governments have rushed to regulate the new technology.³ AI is often thought to be of interest only to the largest of technology companies. However, if it is to be as transformative as some expect, all businesses will have to incorporate it as they have with personal computers and the internet.

Small businesses are already contributing to AI development, as many of the firms developing AI tools are startups, rather than entrenched businesses.⁴ Large businesses outpaced small ones in AI adoption, although the gap has shrunk recently (Figure 1). The digital divide between large and small business use was large and prolonged during previous technological transformations, such as internet access. The purpose of this spotlight is to measure and interpret the divide in AI adoption by size of business using the Census Bureau's new Business Trends and Outlook Survey (BTOS).

In late 2023 and early 2024, the Census Bureau asked businesses in-depth questions about their AI usage. Results revealed a moderate divide that was forming between small businesses (with less than 250 employees) and large businesses (more than 250 employees) in terms of how they are adopting AI. The large-small firm gap is substantially less in the most recent data. However, when looking six months ahead, more large firms anticipate AI use.

Closing the Gap

Six months ago, 6.3 percent of small businesses (less than 250 employees) were using AI compared with 11.1 percent of large businesses (Figure 1), a factor of 1.8. Now, the small business percentage is up to 8.8. Overall, the adoption trajectories shown in Figure 1 suggest that small businesses may only be a year behind large businesses.

The slowed pace of large business adoption may suggest that small businesses could catch up sooner, although a greater percentage of large businesses anticipate adopting AI during the next six months (Figure 2). Interestingly, businesses with less than five employees use AI more than other small businesses, leading to a U-shaped relationship between business size and AI use.
