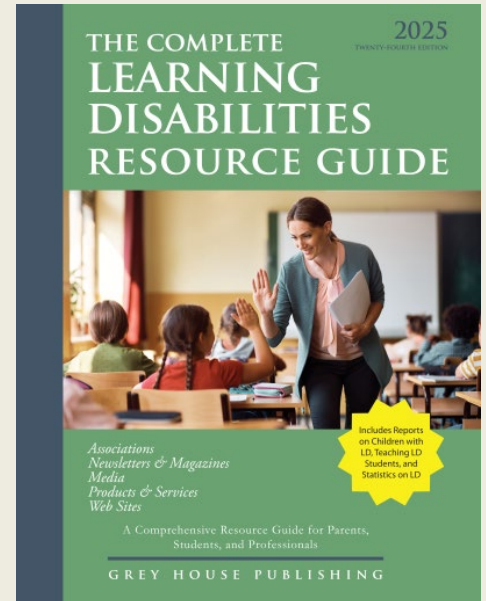
The Complete Learning Disabilities Directory

“Since 1992, this guide has served as a mainstay for stakeholders in the realm of learning disabilities. This twenty-fourth edition begins with an updated report on learning disabilities, an overview of the brain, national statistics about students with disabilities, how K–12 education identifies English learners (including those with disabilities), diagnosed developmental disabilities of minors, and a national report on minority health. The rest of the guide consists of over 4000 entries clustered into 21 chapters, arranged alphabetically, that give basic information about relevant associations, periodicals, websites, media products, and services. Several disabilities, such as Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, have their own chapters. Chapters list summer and exchange programs, camps, classroom resources, computer resources, testing resources, literacy and learning skills, schools and colleges, and training programs. Each entry includes contact information, basic description, and publication information as appropriate...

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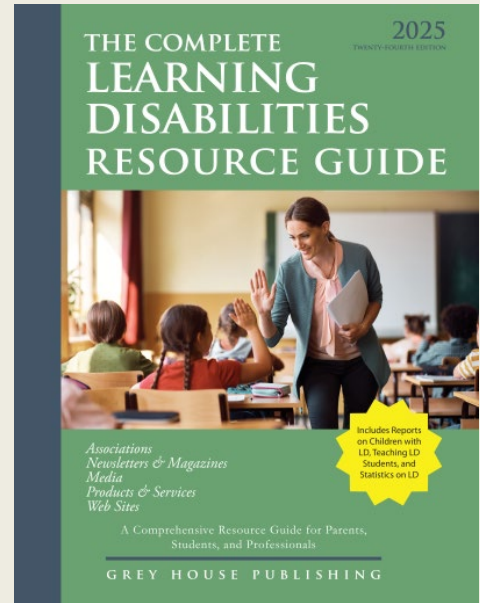
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“The 20th edition of *The Complete Learning Disabilities Directory* begins with an introduction, a handy glossary, a user’s guide, and a user’s key. These are followed by 21 sections, such as Associations & Organizations, Government Agencies, Learning Centers, and Testing Resources. The book concludes with three indexes: “Geographic Index,” “Entry & Publisher Name Index,” and “Subject Index.” The indexes refer to the entry numbers used throughout the book. There are guide words at the tops of pages, and **each section is clearly subdivided to facilitate use**. For example, in the section on ADHD, material is grouped by national programs, publications/videos, and websites. Within these groups, lists are alphabetic. The information provided for each entry varies, but all have basic contact information, the name of the director or key executive, and a brief description. This **reliable and timely reference** will save caregivers and professional’s valuable time. It is **recommended** for public libraries and academic libraries serving schools of education...”
