also successful in protecting airport travelers by getting a bill passed to criminalize the use of laser pointers directed toward aircraft. With John F. Kennedy International Airport in the Senator's District, the legislation was critical in ensuring the safety of pilots and passengers, to discourage impairing the visibility of aircraft operators.

Among other several important pieces of legislation he authored and had signed into law include requiring law enforcement agencies to immediately file a report when an adult is reported missing regardless of age, and another requiring the Department of Homeland Security and emergency services to provide recommendations on implementing tornado warning systems in the state.

In addition to his legislative achievements, Senator Sanders provides many services to his constituents including: free legal assistance once a month for veterans, seniors and women; free tax preparation bi-weekly with representatives from the IRS; his Mobile that travels throughout the District to address constituents' questions, concerns, advice and suggestions; Clergy Breakfasts that monthly bring together the faith-based community to learn and receive training on issues important to them and their congregations; grant writing classes to teach local organizations how to obtain funding to start or expand programs that better the District, and employment opportunities including job fairs for residents.

Prior to being elected to the senate, Sanders was a member of the New York City Council for 12 years. He also sat on Queens School Board District 27 for a decade, including seven years as President, having been the first African American who ascended to that post. He also served in the United States Marine Corps for three years, and holds an undergraduate degree from Brooklyn College. Sanders lives in Queens and is the married father of two.

Senator Jessica Scarcella-Spanton represents New York's 23rd District covering the North and East Shores of Staten Island and Southern Brooklyn. In 2009, Jessica began her career in government as an intern with the NYS Assembly. She was quickly hired as Legislative Director before even completing her Bachelors degree. One point of pride for her is when she was awarded by an advocacy group for her legislative efforts to help families that experienced the tragedy of stillbirth. She worked with the group to organize families from each district to speak to their own Assemblymembers and garnered 148 sponsors for the legislation; that bill is now law today.

After her husband completed his military service, Jessica went to work for Senator Diane Savino in 2017 as her Director of Operations, where she worked for 4.5 years. Some of her major accomplishments were getting over 1000 families across Staten Island and Brooklyn their vaccines when there were no appointments available and successfully fighting to get an Executive Order passed which would require hospitals to allow women in labor a support person when hospitals prevented this during COVID. Jessica briefly worked at the MTA as the Assistant Director of Government and Community Relations.

Jessica was born and raised on Staten Island, New York. She is the daughter of two school teachers. In 2012, she moved to Colorado Springs, where her now husband Josh was serving in the United States Army, their daughter Emily was born just two weeks before he deployed to Afghanistan for the second time. They now reside in West Brighton with their two children, Emily and Jack.

Luis R. Sepúlveda was first elected to represent the 32nd Senate District in April 2018. His Bronx district takes in Parkchester, Castle Hill, Soundview, West Farms, Hunts Point, Longwood, Concourse Village, Melrose, Morrisania, Mott Haven, Claremont, East Tremont, Unionport, Westchester Square, Bronx River, and Crotona Park East. In the Senate, he is Chair of the Crime Victims, Crime, and Correction Committee; and sits on the following committees: Banks; Transportation; Mental Health and Development Disabilities; Judiciary; and Investigations and Government Operations. He is also a member of the Latino Caucus, the Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic, & Asian Legislative Caucus, and the Puerto Rican/Hispanic Task Force.

A staunch advocate for his constituents and the people of the state of New York, Senator Sepúlveda has been a champion of bolstering economic opportunity and social service reforms, especially as they affect middle-class families and the working poor. The Senator has been a leader in criminal justice reform, working to change the culture of distrust between communities of color and the police, and to correct inherent racial biases in the criminal justice system.

As Chair of the Senate Committee on Crimes, Crime Victims, and Corrections, the Senator has been a leader in criminal justice reform, working to change the culture of distrust between communities of color and the police, and to correct inherent racial biases in the justice system. During the 2019 Legislative Session, he oversaw the historic criminal justice reforms in ending cash bail, early discovery, and speedy trial. He continues to lead on legislation supporting rehabilitation and reentry, ending solitary confinement, creating civilian oversight of the state correctional system, and more. Senator Sepúlveda has become a recognized leader in Albany as an advocate for immigrant rights in New York, as the lead sponsor of two of the state's most impactful and historic immigration bills: the NY State Jose Peralta DREAM Act and the Green Light Bill, which respectively expanded access to higher education and driver's licenses for undocumented immigrants.

As a representative of one of lowest income districts in the state and with an unwavering commitment to improving the lives of his constituents, Senator Sepúlveda is deeply engaged in his community and creating opportunities for educational and economic justice. His district office's top priority is to provide reliable, excellent and unrivaled constituent services, on issues including housing, healthcare, immigration, and more. He regularly hosts free workshops, job fairs, and college fairs in the community

Senator Sepúlveda has continuously advocated for increased funding for community health and mental health services. His efforts to raise the visibility among legislators and key opinion leaders of the alarming suicide rate in the Latina teen population proved fruitful most recently when Governor Cuomo announced the formation of the New York State Suicide Prevention Task Force. The Senator also worked closely with Mayor de Blasio in 2014 to secure funding for universal pre-kindergarten in New York City.

He previously served for three terms as the New York State Assemblyman for the 87th Assembly District, covering Parkchester, Castle Hill, West Farms, Van Nest, and Park Stratton. His efforts as Assembly member included sponsoring a bill to create a board to review civilian deaths and near-deaths involving police officers, a bill requiring videotaping of all engagements between uniformed officers and individuals in the community, and advocating for Raise the Age legislation to prevent 16- and 17-year-olds from being charged as adults. He also supported raising penalties for those who commit gun violence against children on school property or at playgrounds, and he backed increased penalties for child sexual abusers.

As a member of the Assembly Corrections Committee, he was honored to serve as Chair of the Subcommittee on Transitional Services, the focal
