Robert Jackson is Senator for New York State Senate's 31st District on the west side of Manhattan. His is the first Muslim New York Senator. In the Senate he is Chair of the Cities Committee and serves on the following standing Committees: Education; Labor; Higher Education; Housing, Construction, and Community Development; Civil Service and Pensions; and New York City Education. State Senator also champions public education, workers' rights, climate justice, and gun safety.

In his first elected position as Community School Board President, Robert Jackson filed a lawsuit against the state to fix an inequitable New York State school funding distribution formula that was cheating NYC schools and undermining our children's future. He walked 150 miles to Albany to highlight the cause and won a court judgment that awarded \$16 billion for NYC schools. As a result of this landmark decision and "for being a staunch advocate for generations of New York City children, for never giving up on the belief that education is a basic civil right, and for giving millions of city students a fighting chance," NY1 honored Robert as New Yorker of the Year.

In 2001, Jackson was elected to the City Council, and was three times overwhelmingly reelected by the voters of his upper Manhattan district. Because of his experience, commitment, and leadership, he was chosen to Chair the Education Committee and Co-chair the Black, Latino, and Asian Caucus.

On the City Council, Jackson worked to make sure every child had the best education that offered by helping to create more than 4,000 new openings for pre-K, fought to prevent thousands of teacher layoffs, and helped start the Drop-Out Prevention Initiative. He worked to increase jobs and opportunities by sponsoring the landmark NYC Minority- and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (M/WBE) law, the Small Business Survival Act, and helped create a community manpower training program cited as a national model by the Clinton Global Initiative. He passed increased immigrant services, was an earlier advocate for marriage equality, and a leader combatting bullying. He fought for smart budget choices that kept senior centers, libraries, and fire stations open. And he worked to make our neighborhoods safer by getting guns off the street through working with community groups, sponsoring Buy Back Programs and advocating for stronger state and federal legislation.

In 2015, Jackson was elected District Leader and help found the new, progressive grassroots Democratic Club, Uptown Community Democrats. Born and raised in Manhattan, Senator Jackson and his family have lived in Washington Heights since 1975. He attended New York City public schools and graduated from SUNY at New Paltz. He is married and a dedicated father of three daughters.

Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, also known as AOC, is the US Representative for New York’s 14th Congressional District since January 3, 2019. The district includes the eastern part of the Bronx and portions of north-central Queens in New York City. In Congress, she sits on the following committees: Financial Services and Oversight and Reform.

Ocasio-Cortez is also a member of the following Caucuses: Pro-Choice; Democratic Women, Congressional Progressive; LGBT Equality; Quiet Skies; and Congressional Bangladesh.

Throughout her childhood, Representative Ocasio-Cortez split her time between the Bronx and Yorktown. While visiting her extended family in the Bronx, she saw a stark contrast in opportunities based on their respective zip codes. After high school, Ocasio-Cortez attended Boston University and graduated with degrees in economics and international relations. During this period, she also had the opportunity to work in the office of the late Senator Ted Kennedy. Her role in Senator Kennedy’s office provided a firsthand view of the heartbreak families endured after being separated by ICE. These experiences led the Congresswoman to organize Latinx youth in the Bronx and across the United States, eventually, she began work as an Educational Director with the National Hispanic Institute, a role in which she helped Americans, DREAMers and undocumented youth in community leadership and college readiness.

Following the financial crisis of 2008, tragedy struck when her father, Sergio Ocasio-Roman, passed away, forcing her family to sell their Westchester home. She pulled extra shifts to work as a waitress and bartender to support her family during this time, deepening her commitment to issues impacting working-class people.

During the 2016 presidential election, she worked as a volunteer organizer for Bernie Sanders in the South Bronx, expanding her skills in electoral organizing and activism that has taken her across the country and to Standing Rock, South Dakota to stand with indigenous communities, then back to New York’s 14th Congressional District to launch her people-funded, grassroots campaign for Congress.

Since her swearing-in to Congress in January of 2019, Congresswoman Ocasio-Cortez has remained committed to serving working-class people over corporate interests and advocating for social, racial, economic, and environmental justice.

Congressman Tom Reed was elected to the US House of Representatives in 2010. Since 2011, he has sat on the powerful Committee on Ways and Means and three of its Subcommittees: Human Resources; Select Revenue Measures; and Social Security, where he is Republic Leader. He also

co-chairs the House Manufacturing Caucus, the Problem Solvers Caucus, and the Congressional Diabetes Caucus.

A former All-American swimmer, Reed graduated from Alfred University in 1993 and from Ohio Northern University College of Law in 1996.

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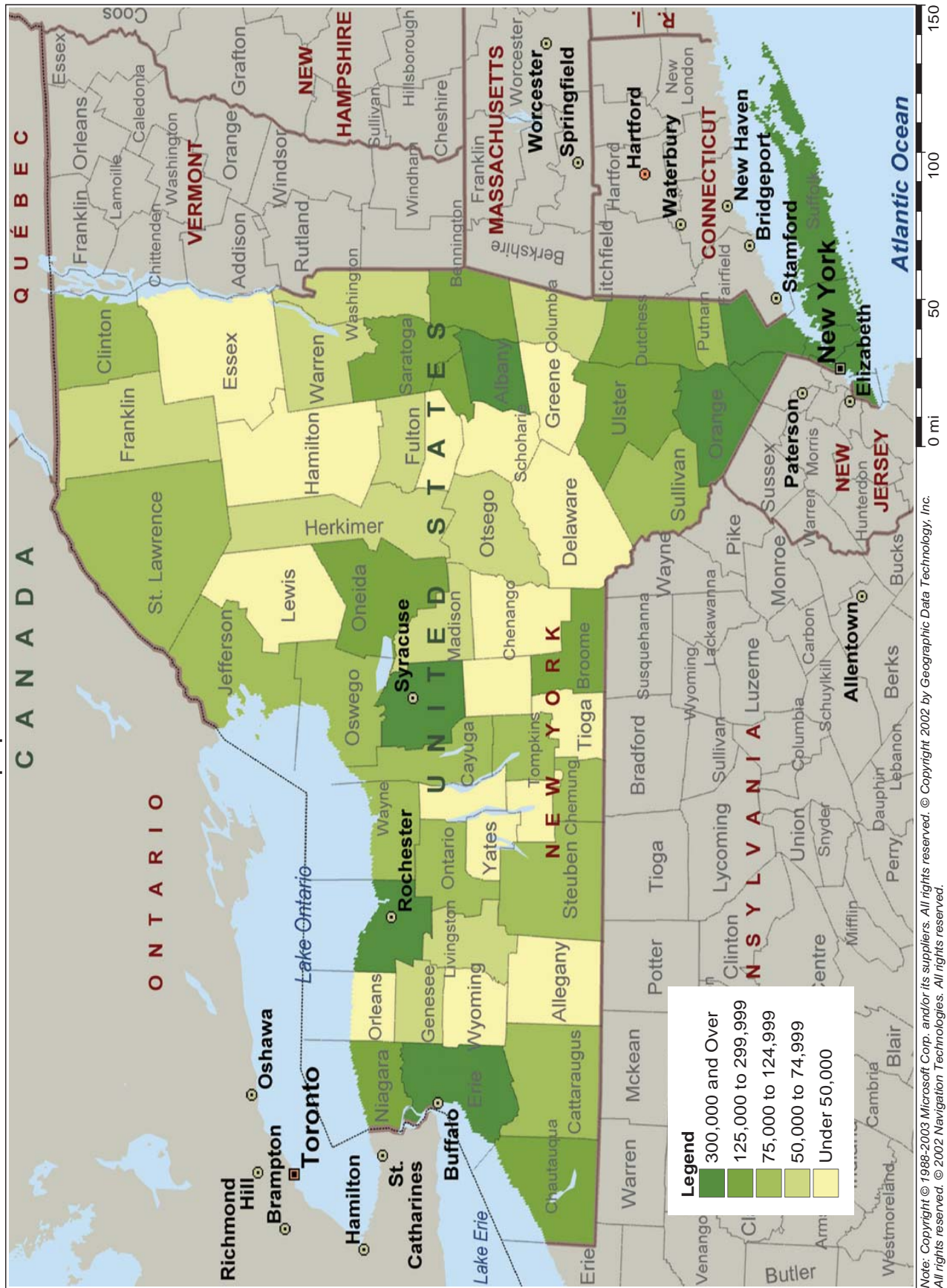
Congresswoman Kathleen Rice represents New York’s 4th Congressional District, which encompasses the majority of Nassau County, NY, a diverse suburban community located on Long Island.

First elected to Congress in 2014, Rice has become a leading voice on national security issues as a member of the Homeland Security Committee, where she passed legislation to improve airport security screening in her first year and conducted rigorous oversight of the Trump Administration’s border policies during her tenure as Chair of the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations. As a member of the Veterans’ Affairs Committee, she established herself as a fierce advocate for veterans and for accountability at the Department of Veterans Affairs, and she authored bipartisan legislation to expand employment opportunities for veterans, which was signed into law in January 2021. For the 117th Congress, Congresswoman Rice was named to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, which has the broadest jurisdiction of any authorizing committee in Congress, and she remains a member of the Homeland Security Committee.

Prior to Congress, Rice ran for District Attorney of Nassau County in 2005 and shocked the Long Island political establishment by defeating a thirty-one-year incumbent, becoming the first woman elected District Attorney in Long Island history. She served as District Attorney from 2006 to 2014, and received national acclaim for her efforts to combat drunk driving, which led to a statewide overhaul of DWI laws and Long Island’s first DWI-related murder convictions. Rice also focused on combating public corruption, launching investigations that led to significant government reforms and the convictions of dozens of officials from both parties who violated the public’s trust.

Congresswoman Rice began her career in public service as an Assistant District Attorney in Brooklyn, NY, where she prosecuted cases of domestic violence and gang activity before joining the office’s elite Homicide Bureau. In 1999, she was appointed an Assistant U.S. Attorney,

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
