

Opinions Throughout History: The Environment

“Independent historian and scholar Issitt provides a comprehensive overview of the environment as an academic subject. **Chapters are arranged in chronological order from the years 1100 to 2017.** Topics are varied and include colonial environmentalism, synthetic pesticides and corporate accountability, changes in the automobile industry, climate change, and the debate over coal, among many others. Primary and secondary sources such as newspaper articles, photographs, court documents, and speeches, coupled with expert analysis, add to readers’ knowledge of how significant figures have shaped their understanding of and interaction with the environment. **Discussion questions at the end of chapters allow readers the further appreciate and raise awareness of environmental issues.** A glossary and timeline of historical events provide additional background information. The author illustrates the complicated history that government officials and significant figures have had in preserving and maintain the environment, while providing possible future recommendations and directions.”


Opinions Throughout History: The Environment

“This latest entry in the publisher’s series examines political, cultural, and scientific thoughts and beliefs regarding environmental concerns in what is now the United States. **This is an exemplary text for debaters, history and science researchers, and current and aspiring activists.** Each of the 28 chapters provides a cogent contextual essay before analyzing a different primary source. Black-and-white photos throughout include images of the reproduced documents, including the handwritten 17th-century “Land Use and Timber Regulations of Pennsylvania” and the first cover of Henry David Thoreau’s *Walden*. **The print is large and the layout well organized so readers can sink into any chapter,** right through the 2017 environmental protections rollbacks of President Trump. Back matter provides further context with a time line and a glossary... **VERDICT A solid addition for those seeking a deep dive into the environment.**”



The title contains 28 chapters, each beginning with an introduction, followed by a list of topics covered, historical overview, the text of the document(s), conclusion, discussion questions, and bibliographic citations. Supplementary materials include a chronology, glossary, historical snapshots, and bibliography. **At the heart of this work are the documents that the respective chapters are built around, and they represent an eclectic mix.** Some can be easily located in other sources, such as the excerpt from John Muir’s *Our National Parks* or President Ronald Reagan’s Statement on Signing the Montreal Protocol on Ozone-Depleting Substances. **This work conveniently packages a variety of primary source documents, including some that focus on particularly salient topics like climate change, and thus would prove useful for school libraries.**”
