



The top photo shows the state capitol building in Madison, the state's second most populous city. Not only a center for education, culture, and natural beauty and recreation, Madison hosts offices for Google, American Girl and Lands 'End, as well as many biotech and health system startups. Milwaukee, bottom, is the largest city in the state and sits on Lake Michigan's western shore.



The Pabst Brewing Company is an American company that dates its origins to a brewing company founded in 1844 by Jacob Best in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and was, by 1889, named after Frederick Pabst. The top photo shows the former Pabst brewery in Milwaukee. The Golda Meir School (originally Fourth Street School) for gifted and talented students is a Milwaukee Public Schools district elementary, middle, and high school in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1979 the school was renamed in honor of Golda Meir, the fourth Prime Minister of Israel, who attended the institution from 1906 to 1912. There are two campuses: the lower campus and the upper campus. The 1890 lower campus building, bottom, is a National Historic Landmark, designated in 1990 for its association with Meir.
