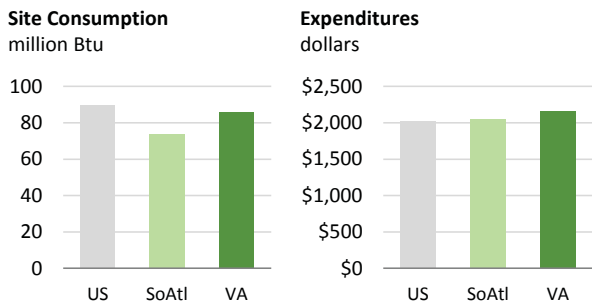

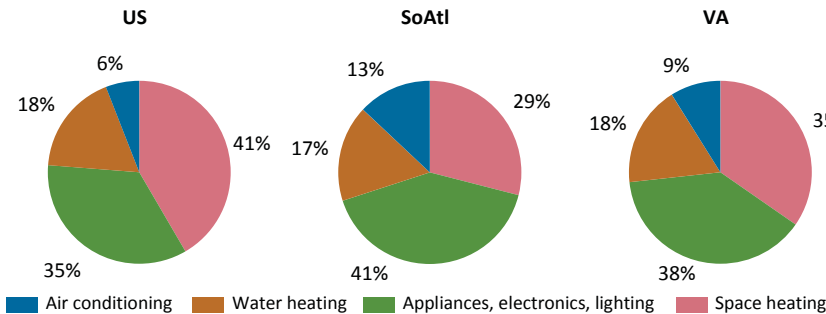
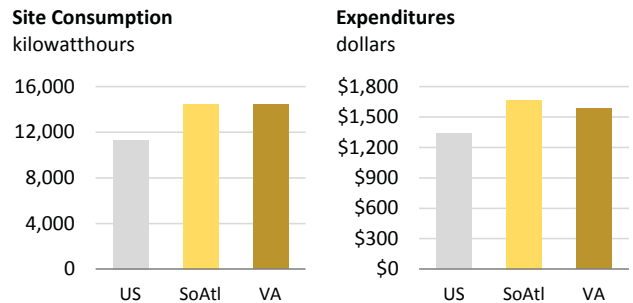
- Virginia households consume an average of 86 million Btu per year, about 4% less than the U.S. average.
- Average electricity consumption and costs are higher for Virginia households than the national average, but similar to those in neighboring states where electricity is the most common heating fuel.
- Virginia homes are typically newer and larger than homes in other parts of the country.



### ALL ENERGY average per household (excl. transportation)



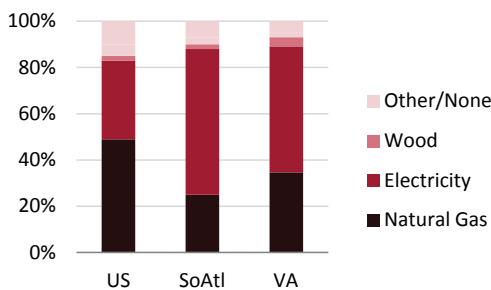
### ELECTRICITY ONLY average per household



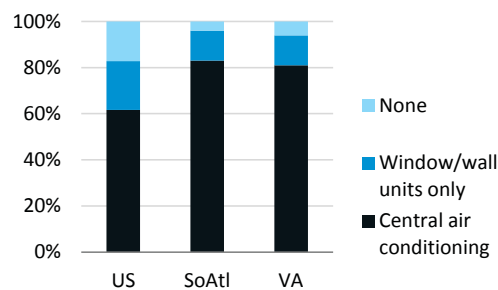
### CONSUMPTION BY END USE

While Virginia's weather is similar to the national average, residents use more energy for air conditioning (9%) and less energy for heating (35%) than is typical in other parts of the country.

Compared to the U.S. average, a greater proportion of Virginia households heat with electricity (55%) and a smaller proportion use natural gas (35%).

Most Virginia residents use air conditioning equipment, with over 80% using central air conditioners and a small share using window/wall units.

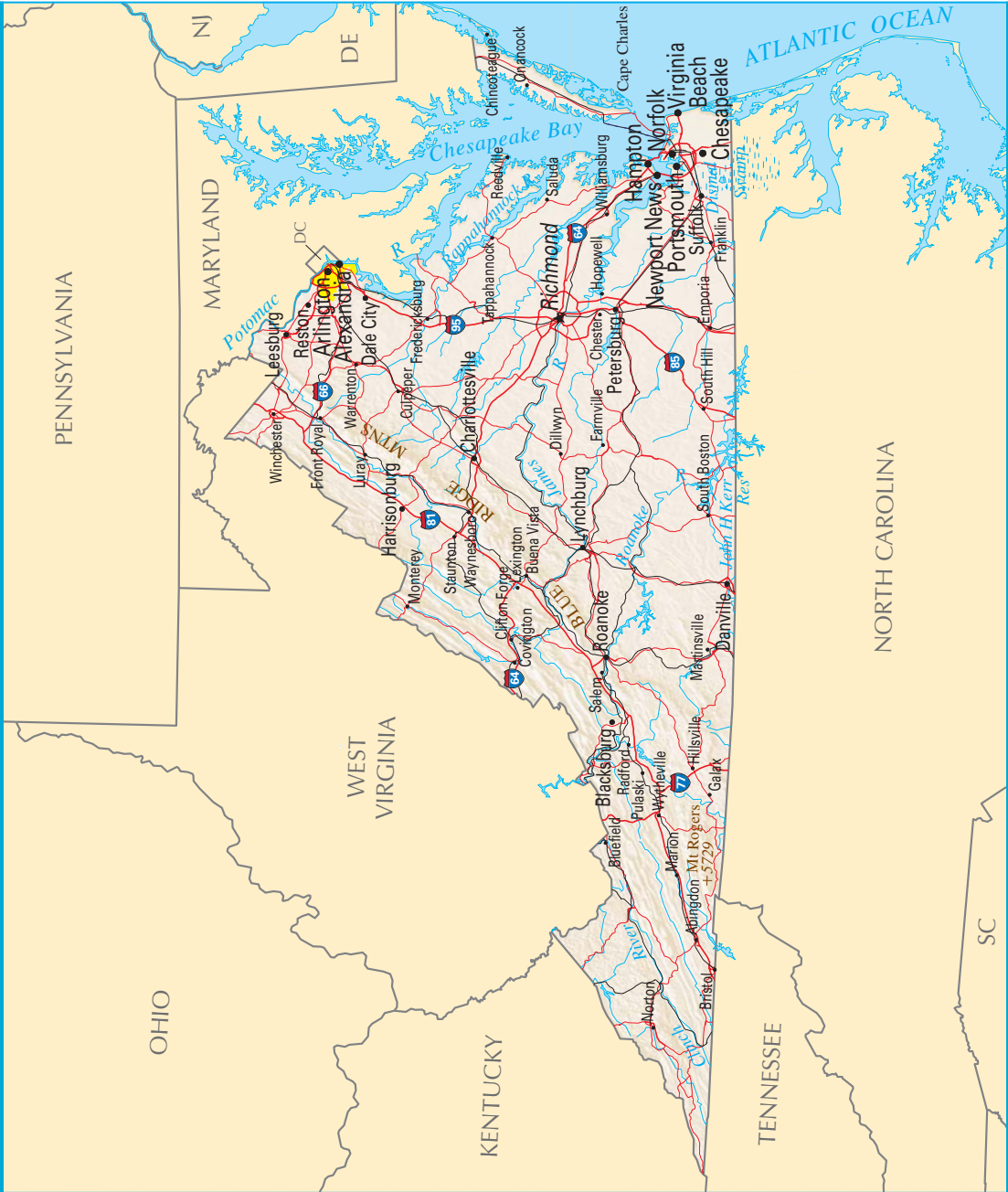
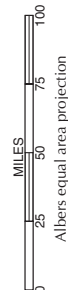
